Good Afternoon,

With the increase of COVID-19 in our community DOH Monroe wanted to send out a few reminders on current CDC guidelines and a list of resources all in one location. As well as more information on school resources and COVID protocols.

Public School Specific Resources for COVID-19

- The Monroe County School District COVID-19 Dashboard is updated daily and can be viewed <u>here</u>.

- The Florida Department of Health COVID-19 Isolation and Quarantine Guidelines for Students in Public Schools can be found <u>here</u>. The guidance included in this document are based off of Emergency Rule 64DER21-12, which can be found <u>here</u>.
- Per this Emergency Rule "protocol for students with exposure to COVID-19 who are known to have been in direct contact with an individual who received a **positive diagnostic test** for COVID-19 should not attend school, school-sponsored activities, or be on school property" until certain guidelines are met.
- Do **NOT** return to school if you are experiencing COVID-19 like illness OR awaiting a PCR test result.
- Due to the increase of COVID-19 in our community many are purchasing over the counter home test kits for rapid identification of COVID-19 if they are having symptoms. Things to do if you have a positive home test/or is reported to you as a provider:
 - Seek addition testing thru one of the community based testing sites, a list can be found <u>here</u>.
 - Report this information to your child's school nurse, or the school if no nurse is on campus. If you have a copy of your home test result via an app please email it to <u>MonroeCOVID@flhealth.gov</u> and email a copy to your child's school nurse.
 - Contact information for school nurses for Monroe County School District can be found <u>here</u>. Please scroll to the bottom and select detailed staff directory for more information.
 - <u>Please know that contract tracing cannot happen at the school level WITHOUT a</u> <u>diagnostic test.</u> For a home test to be considered diagnostic it must be verified by:
 - The provider, and reported to the local health department if they can confirm the positive test result belongs to the patient.
 - Collected at home and sent to a laboratory. The lab will then report the results to the local health department.
 - Results submitted by the parent to a mobile app (Some companies have this app feature such as <u>Ellume</u> which can be purchased at CVS. Test kits like Abbott Binax do not have this feature)
 - If an individual with a <u>diagnostic test</u> for COVID-19 is then exposed to a positive individual <u>after</u> they have already isolated for 10 days they would not need to quarantine with the new exposure if within 90 days. It is important to obtain a test result on your child when they initially feel sick, to avoid unnecessary quarantines with later exposures.
