

Zero HIV Stigma Day is July 21 and is a joint initiative of NAZ and <u>IAPAC</u>, in collaboration with the **Global HIV Collaborative** and **Fast-Track Cities Institute**. <u>**HIV stigma**</u> refers to irrational or negative attitudes, behaviors, and judgments towards people living with or at risk of HIV.

Zero Stigma Day **represents a movement to unite people, communities, and countries to help raise awareness about** <u>HIV stigma and learn about ways to help</u> <u>stop it</u>. This observance is also in honor of Prudence Mabele, the first Black South African woman to publicly share her HIV status.
